## NATURE OF COMPLAINT

At $212 \mathrm{Af}, \mathrm{I}$ received a radio call infoming me that the Uity Police had just received a bomb threat call for the Armory. I went to the Armory and assisted Cpl Disho in checking the area. $\Delta 11$ was in order there.

At 1:35 AM, I was notified by radio that Pres Jamrich had received a call to the effect that some buildings on campus were going to be damaged during tie night, and I was instructed to check all areas, and was notified that the Chief of Security was to be calle I briefed the student assigned to the buildings in the central campus, and checked all areas, with all appearing to be in order. Chief Lyons and Officer Rodgers were called to duty at this time.

At $2: 40 \mathrm{AM}$, I completed a check of the entire Kaye Complex, and reported two Pire Exits unlocked in Kaye, and glass broken on the floor of the Pierce Fire Exit. I then went on patrol.

At $2: 46$ AM, Mrs Jamrich called and roported that two subjects had been standing on the lam of their residence, and then had moved across the street to the entrance of the Presidertis Ming of the University Center. This was checked by the Chief and Officer Rodgers, and both pairols returned ta normal patrol. Shortly afterwards, another cail was received fror: lirs Janich, stating that two additional black stugents had arrived in the area and , ze atting on the wall across from the residence, which is located at the SiC Corner of the iniversity Center. I was instrueted to check with the the two as te what they were doing. I asked the two subjects what they were doing there, and one stat ad they were just sitting. I asked if they were waiting for a ride, and the same sutject stated that they were sitting. I then departed and relayed the information. From this tire until approximately $5: 15 \mathrm{Al}$, I remained in lot C , per the request of Chilef lyons, and observed the area.

4t approxinately $3: 30 \mathrm{AM}$, I observed irom lot $C$, approxinately 40 black persons walking across the front of the Unfveraity Center, and to the front lawn of the Fresijents quarters. I immodiately radiced this information to the desk, and the chief and orficar hodgers went to the arra.

At 5:35 MW, an unknown Individual who delivers morning pajors to the campus, stopped at ny car in lot C, and reported he had observed two black subjects walking on Xitch Ave dith a gas cen, and a black 1964, Chevrclet driving slowly along. I went to the office and called the Gity Police who said they would check it out. Shortly aitterwerds, I talked with a city Police Paturl, wio pointed out the Chevrolet in question ta me as it paesed out present Iocation. They said the IIcense started with the letters $111-.-$.-. I vane to the cffice and went through the parking ticket. files, due to the fact nyself and Orficer lainhart had insued a ticket to a venicle fitting the description about a week proviously. I found the ticket, and the complete license was HNZ 439. The cyner Sa unknown, as there is no wiU Registration on the vehicle. Cpl Dishno was notilied of the corplete number, and he, stated a regintration check would be made with the state valles.

Between approximately $3: 00$ and $5: 15$ AM, I remained mostly in Lot $C$, except for a few trips around the upper canpus area to verify and check on reports of broken windows. There was a broken window in the lounge (music) area of the Fine Arts Bldg, and a broken window in the NA Lobly (stairway) area of the IF Bldg. There was also two lobby windows broten in the second floor of Gries Hall. On one of the reports from Gries Hall, a Tom Sarplle of 221 Gries Hall reported he could identify the two subjects who had thrown a chair throggh a lobby window there. He described them as black, one wearing a wire rimmed set of glasses, and tho other wearing a high school, type jacket. He stated he could identify the two id he saw then again. On the other reports from the other buildings mentioned above, the complainants reported there were black persons in the area at the time of tho incident.

At approximataly $5: 35 \mathrm{AM}$, I drove through Lot B , to check the exterior of the Kaye Complex, and discovered three windows broken in the Kaye BIdg, (Deans Oifice Area), and two broken in the IS Portion of the Olson Library. I notified Officer Rodgers, and checked the entire interlor of the complex, There was a strong odor of gas and a heavy smokey haze in the 18 ye and Olson portion of the complex, and an investigation was conducted into the matter. Officer Salvatore Sarvello of the Security Department reports finding windows braten in the front of Zaye buildine and smoks in the hallway
of the $\quad$ floor of Kove building.

Upon further investigation by Chief Lyons and officers Sarvello and Rodgers of the Security Departzent, the following was discovereds

The lerge centor window, which also has a storm window, in the record ofilice of the Deans Oftice had been broken. This was cone by throwing a bottle of combustible 1lquid which had the odor of gasoline thru the window. This bottle was a quert wied With a Nogen David wine label attached. Hags had been stuffed into the bottle. The bottle dia not breek nor explode however landed on a *ler of cardboard rile's. boxes and settied on its side in between two of the boxea. There was no Gurnits as a result.

In the office which occuplei by Karen Reese, also in the Deans Cifice, was a quary bottle with a Oanete Dry label and also contained what was belleved geooline or caub other high combnatible material. The bottle wes stuffed with raf: Thy, bedty had been thrown thru the large doubble windots siso. The bothe 2 wided between tha will and ridiator which is just beloy this broken vindov, The bottie wae intact and did not explode however th, rags had been ignited but apparently extinguished itseli Hon wi.sm thm. The windov.

The top latge Widiove in the office occupled by Ron Stump in Deans department we e al so broken, This was done with a Gis bottle which was broken and plecee of this botthe tere found in the outter offlce of the Deans. There was no fire in thes section
nic yfinfo of the Cosference roou of the Purchesint department which to on the Exound lepri, had been broken and a comidutible liquid was poured on the 1200 F . This wal lentied sud in thls location was a fire which had burned 1 teelf out hovever alout a thee root sousre af the thag was all charred. The flames had at so scorvind the velis. Ho battie or any parts of sue wea locnted in this woom.
