Such a council as Dr. Jamrich proposes would work to dispel these and leave us prepared to go forward with the university, to help build the community and the university and to serve more efficiently our mutual interests. When the organization meeting is called, we will be ready and cooperative."

Jamrich had indicated a hope that early work could be done toward organization so that it could be a reality in time for the opening of the fall term and in position to offer effective service.

First meetings, it is anticipated, will be directed toward the areas of activity, the approach to be made, the functions of such a council and its membership.
