# Hayward Lake Refuge

Hayward Lake Ketuge

A proposed refuge for migrating geese, covering 70 to 100 square miles in rural Menominee County centered at Hayward Lake, has aroused heated opposition from some residents of the area.

The refuge, proposed by federal and state governments, would be patterned after a similar area near Horicon in Wisconsin.

The basic reason for the proposal to develop a major materfowl project at Hayward Lake is its location on a major flyway for Canada geese, according to the sponsoring governmental agencies.

A considerable portion of the Mississippi Valley flock, which totals about 350,000 birds before hunting segson, funnels south-across the Upper Peninsula, west of Lake Michigan. As many as 150,000 to 170,000 have gathered at the Horicon Refuge, about 135 miles south of the Menominee County site. The geese have created numerous problems of crop damage on farms in the area of the Horicon Refuge.

One major reason the federal government offers for supporting the Hawward Lake refuge is the expectation, that many geese will stop over at that site for some weeks, thereby shortening their stay at the Horicon Refuge. Holding back geese at Hawward Lake, in an area where agricultural damage would not be significant, the agency spokesmen say, would relieve federal officials of the annual headache they get from farmer complaints in the Horicon area.

"First word of the project leaked out several weeks ago and many people are beginning to realize that what government intends to do is going to have a very drastic effect on their personal lives.
"What really is the unfortunate part is that a very important segment of agriculture in Menominee Countyis going to be put out of business by the plan. What is even worse is that families, some of whom have lived on their farms for three generations, are going to be put out of business and moved because some state and federal game experts got the idea that they needed a stopping place for geese making their migratory flights.

The prospect of a vast new wildlife refuge in the Upper Peninsula is an interesting and exciting one. But it must be weighed against some other vital factors, particularly the effects the project would have on residents of the area whose way of life would be changed by the project and on the Menominee County tax base.

A lot more consideration must be given this matter before it is resolved.
